Strive HI, Hawaii State Assessment (HSA), and Smarter Balanced Assessments (SBA)

The Hawaii State Department of Education recently released the 2020-2021 results of the Strive HI Performance System, Hawaii's public school accountability and improvement system. Measures associated with the Strive HI system include data on student proficiency in English language arts/literacy, math, and science as measured by the Smarter Balanced Assessments (SBA) and the Hawaii State Assessment (HSA); student growth in English language arts/literacy and math; chronic absenteeism; 11th grade ACT results; high school graduation rates; college enrollments; and achievement gaps. School results are based on measures from the previous school year; in this case, the 2020-121 school year. Strive HI Highlights for ULS:

- Highest graduation rate in the state, with 100% of our students graduating in four years.
- Ranked third in the state for college enrollment, with 90% of ULS graduates (c/o '20) enrolling in college.
- Lowest chronic absenteeism rate in the state.

Hawaii State Assessment Reports

For those students who were enrolled at ULS in the following grade levels 3-8 or 11 in the 2020-2021 school year, your child will be given a copy of their 2020-21 Smarter Balanced Assessments (gr. 3-8, 11) and Hawai'i State Assessment Science (gr. 5 and 8) Score Reports to bring home **on Wednesday, November 10 in homeroom**.

Panorama Student Perception Survey

The Panorama Student Perception Survey is a confidential student survey that provides the school and teachers with student feedback to enhance teacher practice and improve the learning environment. Additionally, the survey results will be used to calculate the school climate measure for the Strive HI accountability system. The survey will be administered to students in grades 3-12 in school on the following dates: 11/23 - Grades 3-5 | 11/24 - Grades 6-12

ULS Student Travel

We would like to remind all parents to please keep your child at home when not feeling well. If there are people in your household that are sick (siblings, parents, or extended family members), keep your child home even though they themselves may not be sick. Students should not come to school if they or someone in their household is awaiting COVID-19 test results due to being exposed to a positive case. Notify the school right away by emailing health@universitylaboratoryschool.org at any time (nights, weekends, week days) and we will respond with our COVID-19 protocols.
